**Acclamation** *(Celebrant begins with,)*

Alleluia! Christ is risen!

**The Lord is risen indeed! Alleluia!**

**Collect for Purity** *(Celebrant continues,)*

Almighty God, \* **unto Whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from Whom no secrets are hid: Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of Your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love You, and worthily magnify Your holy Name, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.**

## **Summary of the Law** *(the Celebrant begins,)*

God has said, “Oh, that they had such a heart in them that they would fear Me and always keep My commandments, that it might be well with them and with their children forever.” *Deuteronomy 5:29*

Let us affirm our obedience to God with the words of The Greatest Commandment.

Our Lord Jesus Christ said:

“The first of all the commandments is:

**‘Hear, O Israel, the LORD our God, the LORD is one. And you shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength.’**

This is the first commandment. And the second, like it, is this:

**‘You shall love your neighbor as yourself.’**

There is no other commandment greater than these.”

**Lord, have mercy upon us,  
and write these laws in our hearts.**

## **Exhortation to Confession** *(the Celebrant continues,)*

If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. *1 John 1:8-9*

## **Confession** *(all seated, the Celebrant begins,)*

Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

Have mercy upon me, O God, \* **according to Your lovingkindness; according to the multitude of Your tender mercies, blot out my transgressions. Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin. For I acknowledge my transgressions, and my sin is always before me. Against You, You only, have I sinned, and done this evil in Your sight—that You may be found just when You speak, and blameless when You judge.**

*(pause in silence for personal confession, concluding with,)*

Hide Your face from my sins, \* **and blot out all my iniquities. Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a steadfast spirit within me. Do not cast me away from Your presence, and do not take Your Holy Spirit from me. Restore to me the joy of Your salvation, and uphold me by Your generous Spirit. Amen.**

*Psalm 51:1-4,9-12*

## **Declaration of Absolution** *(Celebrant says,)*

Almighty God have ✠ mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life.

**Amen.**

## **Scriptural Assurance of Pardon** *(Celebrant continues,)*

I have swept away your sins like the morning mists. I have scattered your offenses like the clouds. I have paid the price to set you free.

**Sing, O heavens, for the LORD has done this wondrous thing!**

*Isaiah 44:22-23a (NLT)*

**The Gloria** *(all standing; together in unison,)*

**Glory to God in the highest,  
and peace to His people on earth.**

**Lord God, heavenly King,  
almighty God and Father,  
we worship You, we give You thanks,  
we praise You for Your glory.**

**Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father,  
Lord God, Lamb of God,  
You take away the sins of the world:  
have mercy on us;  
You are seated at the right hand of the Father:  
receive our prayer.**

*(at the conclusion of the lection, Reader says,)*

**The Psalter** *(remain seated, the Celebrant continues, saying,)*

The Psalm appointed for today is Psalm 114.

**Psalm 114** *In exitu Israel*

*(at the conclusion of the lection, Reader says,)*

**The Gospel** *(all stand; the Celebrant declares the Gospel, saying,)*

The Holy Gospel ✠ of our Lord and Savior  
✠ Jesus Christ ✠ according to Saint Mark (16:1-8).

*(people may make a small sign of the cross on their forehead, lips, and heart, responding in unison,)*

**Glory to You, Lord Jesus Christ.**

*(at the conclusion of the Gospel, the Celebrant proclaims)*

This is the Gospel of the Lord!

**Praise to You, Lord Jesus Christ!**

**The Homily** *(all seated)*

**The Nicene Creed** *(all stand; Celebrant begins, saying)*

Let us declare our confession of faith, saying...

**I believe in one God,  
the Father Almighty,  
Creator of heaven and earth,  
and of all things seen and unseen.**

**I believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,  
eternally begotten of the Father,  
God of God, Light of Light,  
True God of True God,  
begotten, not made,  
of one being with the Father,  
Through Whom all things were made.  
Who for us and our salvation  
came down from heaven,  
and was made incarnate  
by the Holy Spirit  
of the Virgin Mary,  
and was made man.  
For our sake He was crucified  
under Pontius Pilate.  
He suffered death and was buried.**

**On the third day He rose again  
in fulfillment of the Scriptures;  
He ascended into heaven  
and is seated at the  
right hand of the Father.  
He shall come again in glory  
to judge the living and dead,  
and His kingdom shall have no end.**

**I believe in the Holy Spirit,  
the Lord and giver of life,

## **The Offertory Dedication** *(Celebrant continues,)*

Pray, brethren, that our sacrifice may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father.

**May the Lord accept this sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of His Name, for our good, and the good of all His Church. Amen.**

Blessed are You, Lord God of Israel, our Father, forever and ever. For all that is in heaven and earth is Yours; Yours is the kingdom, O Lord, and You are exalted as head over all. And from Your own we now give back to You these gifts in honor and worship of Your Son, Jesus Christ, our Lord. Therefore, O God, we thank You and praise Your glorious name.

**Amen.**

## **The Great Thanksgiving** *(Celebrant continues,)*

The Lord be with you.

**And with your spirit.**

Lift up your hearts.

**We lift them up to the Lord.**

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

**It is right to give Him thanks and praise.**

It is a right, good, and joyful duty, that at all times and in all places we should give thanks to You, Almighty Father, Everlasting God, Creator of heaven and earth.

But chiefly are we bound to praise You for the glorious resurrection of Your Son Jesus Christ our Lord; for He is the true Paschal Lamb, Who was sacrificed for us, and has taken away the sin of the world. By his death He has destroyed death, and by His rising to life again He has won for us everlasting life.

Therefore with Angels and Archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we laud and magnify Your glorious Name; evermore praising You, saying,

**Holy, holy, holy Lord,  
God of power and might;  
heaven and earth are full of Your glory.  
Hosanna in the highest.  
✠ Blessed is He who comes  
in the Name of the Lord.  
Hosanna in the highest!**

**Prayer of Consecration** *(all seated or kneeling)*

*[This is the Communion Prayer  
of St. Basil the Great from 370 A.D.]*

We acclaim You, holy Lord, glorious in power. Your mighty works reveal Your wisdom and love. You formed us in Your own image, placing the whole world into our care so that, in obedience to You, our Maker, we might rule and serve all Your creatures.

When our disobedience took us far from You, You did not abandon us to the power of death. In Your mercy You came to our aid, so that in seeking You we might find You. Again and again You called us into covenant with You, and through the prophets You taught us to hope for Your salvation.

Father, because of Your great love for the world, in the fullness of time You sent Your only-begotten Son to be our Savior. Incarnate by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, He lived as one of us yet without sin.

To the poor He proclaimed the Good News of salvation; to prisoners, freedom; and to the sorrowful, joy. In obedience to Your eternal purposes, He gave Himself up to death and, rising from the grave, destroyed death and made all of creation new.

And, that we might live no longer for ourselves, but for Him who died and rose for us, He sent the Holy Spirit, His own First Gift for those who believe in Him, to complete His work in the world and to bring to fulfillment the sanctification of all.

When the hour had come for Him to be glorified by You, and having loved His own who were in the world to the end, at Supper with them He took bread, and when He had given thanks to You, He broke it, and gave it to His disciples, and said, “Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.”

After Supper He took the cup of wine, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, and said, “Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me.”

Father, we now celebrate this eternal testimony of our redemption. Recalling Christ’s death and His descent among the dead; proclaiming His resurrection and ascension to Your right hand; awaiting His coming again in glory; and offering to You, from the gifts You have given us, this bread and this cup; we praise You and bless You.

*(Celebrant and people in unison,)*

**We praise You, we bless You,  
We give thanks to You,  
And we pray to You, Lord our God.**

*(Celebrant continues,)*

Lord, we pray that in Your goodness and mercy Your Holy Spirit may descend upon ✕ us, and upon these gifts, † sanctifying them to be holy gifts for Your holy people, the Bread of Life and the Cup of Salvation, the Body and the Blood of Your Son Jesus Christ.

Grant that all who share this Bread and Cup may become one body and one spirit, a living sacrifice in Christ, to the praise of Your Name.

Remember, O Lord, Your One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church, redeemed by the blood of Your Christ. Reveal its unity, guard its faith, and preserve it in peace.

Remember *Foley*, our chief Bishop; *Richard*, our Bishop; and all who faithfully minister the Gospel throughout Your Church.

Remember all who have died in the peace of Christ, and those whose faith is known to You alone; bring them into the place of eternal peace, joy, and light.

And grant that we may find our eternal inheritance with the patriarchs, prophets, apostles, martyrs, and all the saints who have found favor with You in ages past. We praise You in union with this great cloud of witnesses and give You glory through Your Son Jesus Christ our Lord.

Through Christ, with Christ, and in Christ, all honor and glory are Yours, Almighty God and Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, for ever and ever.

**AMEN!**

### **The Lord's Prayer** *(Celebrant continues,)*

And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to pray:

**Our Father, Who art in heaven,  
hallowed be Thy Name.  
Thy kingdom come.  
Thy will be done,  
on earth as it is in heaven.  
Give us this day our daily bread.  
And forgive us our trespasses,**

**as we forgive those who trespass  
against us.  
And lead us not into temptation,  
but deliver us from evil.  
For Thine is the kingdom, and the power,  
and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.**

## **The Breaking of the Bread** *(Celebrant continues,)*

Alleluia! Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us;  
**Therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia!**

## **Invitation to Holy Eucharist** *(the Celebrant says,)*

These are the gifts of God for the People of God. Take them in remembrance that Christ died for you, and feed on Him in your hearts by faith, and with thanksgiving.

*(the Celebrant receives Communion first and then serves the people who come forward; serving the bread, saying,)*

The Body of our Lord Jesus Christ,  
broken for you.

**Amen.**

*(serving the cup, saying)*

The Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ,  
shed for you.

**Amen.**

*(those desiring special anointing and the laying on of hands for healing, or prayers in proxy for others, may respond as directed)*

## **Post-Communion Prayer** *(Celebrant begins, saying,)*

The Lord be with you.

**And with your spirit.**

Let us pray...

Almighty and everliving God, \* **we thank You for feeding us with the most precious Body and Blood of Your Son our Savior Jesus Christ; and for assuring us in these Holy Mysteries that we are living members of the Body of Your Son, and heirs in Him of Your everlasting kingdom. And now, Father, through the merits of Your dear Son, grant us grace that we may continue in that holy fellowship, conducting ourselves in good works as You have prepared for us to do. This we ask in the Name of Jesus Christ our Lord, to Whom with You and the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, world without end. Amen.**

**The Blessing** *(all remain standing, Celebrant says,)*

Greatly rejoice in the LORD, be joyful in your God; He has clothed you with the garments of salvation, and has covered you with the robe of righteousness. You shall be called by a new name, which the mouth of the LORD will name. And as the bridegroom rejoices over the bride, so shall your God rejoice over you. And the blessing of God Almighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, be with you and remain upon this day and always.

*cf., Isaiah 61:10; 62:2,5*

**Saint Brendan's Proclamation** *(Celebrant begins the Great Levitical Hymn of Nehemiah 9:5-ff, saying,)*

Stand up and bless the LORD your God forever and ever! \*

**Blessed be Your glorious name,  
which is exalted above all blessing  
and praise!  
You alone are the LORD;  
You have made heaven,  
the heaven of heavens,  
with all their hosts,**

**the earth and everything on it,  
the seas and all that is in them,  
and You preserve them all.  
You are God, ready to pardon,  
gracious and merciful,  
slow to anger,  
abundant in kindness.  
You are the LORD God!**

**Recessional Hymn** *(remain standing)* Hymnal, #216

**The Dismissal** *(Celebrant dismisses the people, saying,)*

rejoicing in the triumph and glory of Jesus Christ!

**Postlude** *(please remain standing in silent praise while the candles  
are being extinguished)*
